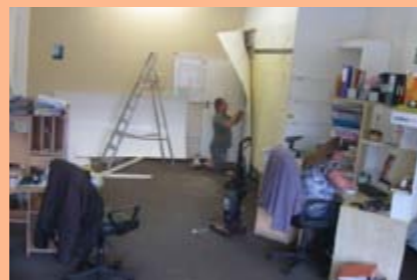

## The Forum Expands Across The Valley

At the beginning of August the Gaunt Shops were a hive of activity. Not only were the newly painted shop shutters causing a real stir among local people, but the movers were in and 187 Blackstock Road: the home of Gleadless Valley Community Forum was being emptied. A range of staff from the Forum have now relocated to the excellent new facility in Herdings, at the top of the Valley, simply known as Herdings Youth Club. The venue was reopening by Uriah Rennie back in November of 2010 and now the Forum has been entrusted with the task of managing and developing the building, making sure that it is open and available to everyone within the Gleadless Valley community.



An open day is planned for September once all those little teething problems with phone lines and internet connections have been ironed out, so look out for posters advertising the event or keep an eye on our website ([www.gvcf.org.uk](http://www.gvcf.org.uk)). The Forum will still be busy at the Gaunt Shops. In fact, perhaps busier than ever. The 187 office is now undergoing a major facelift and will be reopening in September as the much improved Online open access Computer Centre for the benefit of the community. This will be known as Phase 3 of the Forum's programme. Once complete, we will be working with the City Council, local traders and other community partners to plan the development of a local community café at 181 Blackstock Road (previously the Valley Online Centre). While this is only in the planning stage, it is an exciting project and will be a wonderful asset for the community, a real meeting point and place to sit and chat over a cup of tea.



## Positive Activities for 8 to 13 year old Grants

The Positive Activities Small Grants for activities for 8 to 13 year olds aim to support the city's Youth Strategy by making available small amounts of money up to £2,000 per group to small voluntary, community and self-help groups that want to make a difference in their local community by providing positive activities for young people aged between 8 and 13 years.

The activities do not have to be targeted exclusively at this age range but we expect at least 75% of the young people taking part to be aged between 8 and 13 years. ### South Community Assembly update Helping to improve Road Safety

Following concerns raised by people living in the South Assembly Area about the

issue of speeding cars, the Assembly, in partnership with South Yorkshire Police, purchased a Unipar Speed Camera and Speed Indicator display board. The equipment has been deployed on numerous occasions to areas where motorists are known to be exceeding the permitted speed limit.

Police Officers have been trained in the use of the equipment, and have used various methods to deal with offenders. These have ranged from words of advice to attendance at speed awareness courses and summons to the local magistrates court.

Police Community Support Officers (PCSO) have also liaised with local schools and have involved young people in watching the camera in action and handing drivers requests to please slow down.

Following on from the success of the Unipar Camera the Assembly has now purchased 2 Speed Indication Devices which many residents may have seen over deployed in various locations over the last few months.

## What is the New Third Sector Assembly and why smaller organisations should join?

The Assembly is a new body that strengthens the Third Sector, made up of Voluntary, Community and Faith based organisations in Sheffield. It will listen to and represent the views of the sector to influence strategic planning and policy decisions. Gleadless Valley Community Forum were one of the first to join the membership.

It will help to address the difficulties that Third Sector organisations, and strategic planning bodies face when attempting to improve services in Sheffield.

The assembly empowers members, particularly those from smaller groups, to feed in local intelligence to the assembly (through the website or themed meetings) so that this information can be taken to strategic meetings by Third Sector assembly representatives.

It will also be a means for strategic partnerships or organisations to communicate information to the Third Sector such as consultations, funding and commissioning information.

## Playscheme – Summer 2011

Well here it is, the end of yet another Summer Playscheme. Where do I start on this one????

Although the number of days, hours and staff levels were slightly reduced, I can honestly say this one has been fantastic. The kids have had a great time, staff have enjoyed it and altogether we've achieved some brilliant results.

The kids enjoyed trips out bowling, swimming, rollerblading as well as visits to museums and different parks and a final trip to the seaside at Mablethorpe as requested by young people last year. Young people themselves have designed quiz games, pass the parcel forfeits, arranged a party and even cooked themselves a hot dinner (with help from staff), of beef stew and dumplings.



The project has again worked with the Rangers from Parks and Woodlands who with the kids have done some pyrography, wood decorating, made a bench and transformed an old tree stump into a play table for the outside area of Herdings Youth Club. The outside looks great and the kids have asked for more of the same next time.

# Thriving District Local Centres

Gleadless Valley Community Forum was asked by Sheffield City Council to be part of a project called Thriving District Local Centres. This project is focusing on the little shopping centres that have been forgotten and looks at ways to improve them.

Gaunt Shops were chosen as one of these centres. So far we have seen 3 new planters installed on the terminus island and hanging baskets on the lamp posts.



Do you remember the grey shop shutters which used to come down Each afternoon making the place look so drab?

Three Urban Artists from Leicester, known as North Side Designz (Dan, Richard & Jake) were contracted in to find out from the shop owners how they would like the shutters brightened and improved.



After a couple of weeks, the shop owners had finalised their designs. The whole job of painting the shutters was completed one warm weekend in July to the excitement of local people, many of whom came along to help out. Below are some of the wonderful results of that work.



The shutters at 187, the Forums main office were designed again by the artists along with a lot of influence from the Valley Education and Skills staff and service users, as this is where the online centre will be moving to in the next couple of weeks. Members of Herdings Youth Club also got to spray some of this design.

All in all the weekend of the 30<sup>th</sup> & 31<sup>st</sup> July was really great. The artists worked incredibly hard not finishing till 11:30pm on the Sunday night.

The shutters are now bright, vibrant and exciting, reflecting the activity that takes place behind them each day.

**Thank you to everyone who came down on that weekend.**

The shop owners came down to see the work in progress some even got a chance to have a go at spraying their own shutters. Alan Hartley arrived just in time to see his dad's name A.E.
